




#### Trauma hospitalization records reported by entities in TSA R were down in 2015





## Fall or motor vehicle traffic was the mechanism of injury for 71% of records





#### For both males and females, most injuries were unintentional




Male Unintentional, 85%

**Unintentional, 96%** 


#### Males were more likely to have injuries due to self-harm or assault






### For ages <65 years, there were more records submitted for males for in every age group






### Most records for individuals 65 years and older had fall as the mechanism of injury






### There were 119,912 EMS runs reported for 2015 by entities in TSA R






### The type of service requested varied by county
