Agenda item: Burn Care **Presenter:** Diana Grimm-Mapp

Discussion:

Request from the Blocker Burn unit is for all hospitals/EMS providers to discontinue use of Silvadene on burns. Silvadene is often not applied correctly and can cause damage to unburned skin. Please use sterile saline soaked sterile gauze to cover wounds. Refer to the Burn Clinical Practice Guideline on TETAF website. https://sk75w2kudjd3fv2xs2cvymrg-wpengine.netdna-ssl.com/wp-content/uploads/2016/01/Burn-Practice-Guideline_vs9-FINAL-REVISED-Sept-2016.pdf (copy provided)

Conclusions: Review policies in your facilities for use of silvadene. Recommend removing silvadene from the policy and replacing with sterile saline soaked gauze and/or cover with clean dry sheet.

Discussion:

The survey results were shared with Garrett Hall. Sample agenda item was provided by him with recommendations to focus on Data Validation and Report Building. Given the objectives for each section, concern that course should be extended to 1.5 days. In addition, questions were raised regarding prerequisites with EXCEL along with concern if participants will need to remotely access their own registry. These questions will be sent to Garrett along with a request for possible dates in late July. Participants also questioned if the meeting could be held via Web Ex.

Agenda item: Collaboration with Stop the Bleed

Discussion:

Current report on the Bleedingcontrol.org site shows that in the US >15,000 instructors and trained >124,000. In TX just over 1000 instructors and trained 7111 participants. NY, CA have trained >11,000 participants and PA/FL have trained more than 7000 participants.

Inquiry as to number of facilities that have presented the program revealed a very small number of hospitals in attendance have actually presented the program. Scheduling in schools continues to be a challenge and recommendation for one hospital to take the lead in a county where multiple hospitals and schools are located, ie: one hospital be responsible for a specific school, etc. Remember to log courses on the Bleedingcontrol.org website.

If you schedule a course outside our region please collaborate with the hospital nearest the facility and invite them to participate in the program. If you scheduled the course, you are responsible for logging the course on the website which must be made very clear to any facility you invite to assist in training.
